RESOLUTION # 2012-123: RESOLUTION AWARDDING THE BID FOR FY 2012 NJDOT TRUST FUND RESURFACING OF FRANKLIN AVENUE

Mayor Green asked Engineer to comment.

Mr. Cray reported that they had two base bids because the grant amount was about 70% of what we requested. He commented that the project could have gone a certain distance if they provided a full grant amount. He stated that they stretched it as much as they could but with the available money the project will go from Cross Keys Road to Grant Avenue. He reported that it happens to be where the stretch of skid and utility trenches are from the cable company that are very annoying; they are all encompassed in that area. Mr. Cray stated that the next block from Grant Avenue to Ramblewood Drive that being the second time you reach Ramblewood Drive is the part that is beyond the money of the grant and was not able to be stretched. He commented that stretch does not have the annoying cable trenches and will not be done due to not receiving enough grant money. Mr. Cray reported that is why their recommendation was for contract two in the amount of \$137,400.00.

Mayor Green opened the meeting to the public.

Joyce Howard – 7 East 4th Avenue

She asked if there was any progress on spraying for the Mosquitos.

Administrator Bileci commented that many residents are calling and questioning about their neighborhood being sprayed. She stated that the Borough calls the Camden County Mosquito Commission who goes out in two to three days of the request so if you are having issues just give us a call.

Joyce Howard stated that they did come out to her house a couple of months ago. She stated that there are empty houses on the street where the grass is high.

Administrator Bileci commented that if there is continuing issues just give us a call and we will get them to come right out.

Joyce Howard asked what do they do about it once they check because they came and checked but there has been nothing done.

Administrator Bileci commented that the consistency spraying is supposed to deter the mosquito control. She said that it is what the agency handles and so they can go out and spray again we just need to know.

Councilman Warrington commented that we should get the code enforcement official out there to check the areas with high grass which might help.

Administrator Bileci asked what the address would be of those areas.

Joyce Howard stated that the address of the one property would be 10 East 4th Avenue. She said she would call in with the other one which is up the street.

Mayor Green asked Administrator Bileci to call the County again.

Walt Davis – 1 Franklin Avenue

He stated that he seen them surveying on Franklin Avenue which they have done in years prior. He asked about the repaving and if it was definitely being contracted out.

Mayor Green commented that we just awarded a contract tonight to start at Cross Keys Road and go to Grant Avenue. He stated that they will be milling, paving and there will be some driveways that will have to be adjusted.

Mr. Cray stated that if there is any concrete work that does not work with the pavement then it gets adjusted.

Mr. Davis stated that there are no pot holes on that road and he felt that the road really does not need it. He feels the road is in pretty good shape.

Mayor Green stated that the road does have the trenches.

Mr. Davis commented that somebody comes along, inspects and that is what they decide.

Councilman Knott reported that we have had various complaints from the residents.

Mr. Davis asked in what regard.

Councilman Knott commented to the reverse speed bumps.

Mr. Davis asked if there was a start date.

Mayor Green stated that it would be at least 60 days and that it will be posted on the Borough website.

Mr. Cray stated that if it was not for the CCMUA's project we would expedite it and get it rolling.


Councilwoman McCullen reported that before our next meeting the Rec Commission will meet Saturday at 10:00.
