Council Reports:

Councilman Jaxel reported that the senior luncheon went very well.

Councilwoman McCullen reported that as Community Affairs Representative for the Borough she was contacted by Mrs. Knott President of the American Legion Auxiliary in Pine Hill with a request for Pine Hill Borough to sponsor one of the girls selected by the American Legion New Jersey group for girls' state. She stated that the cost to sponsor one of the girls for the program is \$220.00 and the girls are chosen by the American Legion Auxiliary members who participate in the program. She commented that they would attend mandatory orientation and go away for a week. Councilwoman McCullen reported that they are taught knowledge about government, laws, college and life in general. She commented that she told President Knott that she would bring this up to Council in hopes that Council will vote to support this endeavor by the American Legion Auxiliary. She reported past and upcoming meeting details regarding the Parks and Rec Commission.

Councilman Warrington thanked Chief Winters for the police community awareness event tour he participated in which went to various law enforcement memorials and schools ending in Pine Hill.

Councilman Burke reported that the Environmental Commission only has two interest parties regarding the community garden so at this time they will be tabling it for now. He commented that at the Parks and Rec meeting they did not have enough people for a quorum, but they did have a conversation in regards to background checks.

Mr. Angelastro reported that he and the Borough Administrator met with the contractor for the Bowen field and he is expected to be in the construction path this week. He stated that he also spoke with the contractor for the Cross Roads project and he is expected to be in Monday the 23rd.

Mr. Greer reported that Maguire Park has had all spring grooming done and the property will continue to be overseen.

Mayor Green reported that Councilwoman McCullen would like to make a motion that the Borough sponsors one young lady for girls' state and the cost would be \$220.00.


