Mayor Green opened the meeting to the public.

Mike Bartfalvi – 17 Penn Drive – Pine Hill, NJ

He stated that he lives on Crest Road and Penn Drive on the corner. He commented that there is a section of the block itself going east that is fairly dark. He stated that he is not sure how to go about requesting a street light or something like that. He said that there is one at the intersection of Penn and Crest and there is one down at the corner but there is nothing in between and it is a rather dark area. He wanted to raise it as a concern, not sure what he has to do or where he has to go to inquire.

Mayor Green stated that he would have the Chief of Police look into it. He commented that based on the Chief's recommendations we will think about doing an actual survey, which would determine whether or not we put a light in that particular section.

Mike Bartfalvi reported that he also has a concern about Veteran's Park. He stated that he is a veteran and a member here at Post 286. He commented that he has been through the park a number of times and he has talked with the Chief of Police to discuss some things about it. His concern is that lately in the last several weeks he has had the opportunity to go there later in the evening and earlier mornings. He stated that even though our Public Works people pick up the trash and everything else people have just destroyed the park as far as loiter. He said the pavilion is being rammed sacked, the electrical connections are being broken; there are some of the power strips broken. He said it is a concern to him because it is a source of pride for him in Pine Hill and again being a veteran it is a memorial for the veterans who have passed on.

Mayor Green reported that the Borough is aware of it and it is a source of pride for them too. He said that one of the things we did do recently was enact a curfew to apply with the same curfew as the rest of the ball fields. He commented that dusk to dawn which gives the Chief the important powers to move people along if they still resist he will issue a citation. Mayor Green stated that we are constantly cleaning up which becomes a vicious cycle. He reported the Borough is looking into installing possibly next year with some capital money additional cameras out there.

Mike Bartfalvi invited Mayor Green on behalf of the Post to participate in their ceremony for Veterans Day on November 11th. Mike Bartfalvi asked Mayor Green to be their guest speaker.

Mayor Green said that he would be honored to be there.

Mike Bartfalvi also commented that the Post is having a breakfast fundraiser at Apple bees on October 13th which they are selling tickets for \$8.00.

Motion to Close to the Public: Councilman Shultz, 2nd Councilman Jaxel

Council Reports:

Councilman Jaxel commented that there will be a Municipal Alliance Meeting next Monday, October 8th at 7:00 pm.

Councilwoman McCullen reported about Fire Prevention Week. She stated that she did not know when our next meeting is whether it is before or after, but that the Fire Department is very active with activities scheduled at their site on Fire Prevention Week.

Mayor Green commented that Fire Prevention activities at the Fire Department are actually tomorrow night at 7:00 to 9:00.

Councilwoman McCullen reported that the Fire Department went into the schools and did a little program. She commented that the Rec Commission Meeting will be on Saturday, October 13th at 10:00 am. She said that hopefully they will have an opportunity to discuss beforehand Public Works and Public Safety areas that concern the Bowen Field. She wanted it to go on record for those members of the community and she stated that now she is speaking as a private citizen those members that volunteered of their time, effort and helped Susan Rupp Foundation tie up their ribbons of hope. She stated that unfortunately the month is over, but let's hope that we made a difference in making this an issue that woman are aware of. She reported that the Susan Rupp Foundation was very fortunate to be invited to Trenton last Thursday to speak on behalf of the Ovarian Cancer Bill which realigns the state of New Jersey with Washington, DC in proclaiming the month of September as Ovarian Cancer. She stated through that effort they were able to reach out with six other assemblymen as well as make big gains Assemblyman Greenwald and Assemblywoman Lampitt.

Mayor Green said that he thought that they did a great job. He reported that the Borough received a lot of positive comments not just here, but in the surrounding towns as well.

Councilwoman McCullen commented that they went to 30 towns' this year. She reported that years ago they had Pine Hill one town.


Mayor Green stated to let the record reflect that Councilman Warrington has arrived.
